Did You Know . . .

The NEFHRC Fall 2015 Hunt Test is currently scheduled for the weekend of September 5-6, 2015, at Mossy Pond. It takes a lot of work to host a hunt test and a lot of people to handle that work. Please consider volunteering to help with the hunt test.

To help you decide where you can best be utilized, a summary of the duties and responsibilities for each job is listed below:

Hunt Test Committee

This is a committee comprised of the Hunt Test Chair and four other persons that will be listed in the Hunt Test Premium.

Committee members must be present at the Hunt Test set-up to assist with, review, and approve the legality of the tests set up by the judges. The Committee is also responsible for handling any official complaints that might arise during the event, and other duties as may be required.

Hunt Test Chair

The Hunt Test Chair is in OVERALL charge of the Hunt Test. The duties include:

- Appointing the Hunt Test Secretary, Head Marshall, Game Steward, Gun Captain, Hospitality Person and any other position the Chair deems necessary to run the tests.
- ♦ Hiring ALL judges (may not apply to UKC tests)
- ♦ Hiring or getting Bird Boys for all stakes
- ♦ Fielding any complaints or misconduct reported at the hunt test
- ♦ Securing the Test Dogs for each stake
- ♦ Overall supervision of the Hunt Test Committee
- Must be present at the Hunt Test set-up and see that all pertinent Hunt Test Committee members are present to approve the tests at all stakes, Master, Senior & Junior, Stated,

Seasoned and Finished for UKC.

Hunt Test Secretary

Duties are:

- Sends in Hunt Test Application to UKC.
- Compile the Premium List, send it to members and post it to the website (hard copies are available upon request).
- Send out Judges Packets that include an Expense sheet, cover letter and Judges Affirmation form and/or Judges Apprentice Form.
- Receive all Hunt Test entries—email confirmation to ALL entries with email addresses.
- ♦ Compile and print the catalogs.
- ♦ Have Pass/Fail Slips made out for ALL entrants and make sure they are signed by the Judges for each state (UKC only).
- ♦ Make the Hunt Test Report to AKC or UKC.
- Be on the premises of Hunt Test all weekend, supply extra Judges sheets, apprentice sheets, junior handler sheets, and all secretarial material needed.
- ♦ Make Judges Books—order Judging sheets.
- ♦ Draw Running Order and post it to the website.
- ♦ Order Hunt Test Rosettes and Duck Bands.

Head Marshall—Stake Marshalls

The Marshalls are virtually responsible for everything and everyone at each stake. They regulate the flow of the test—KEEP IT MOVING.

The Marshalls are responsible for the Running Order at their individual stakes.

They are also responsible for all equipment at their stake, making sure they have what they need and are responsible for moving that equipment from the Land test to the Water test. They also make sure all equipment is back at the trailer at the end of the test.

Marshalls control the gallery, handle communications between handlers and judges, and are responsible for the Bird Boys. Marshalls are also to report ANY misconduct of any kind to the Hunt Test Chair.

Game Steward

Duties:

- Orders the birds needed for the Hunt Test and ensures they are delivered on time to the test location.
- Dispatch all birds humanely and see that each stake has the correct number of birds requested.
- Dispose of and bag all birds that are going to be saved for freezing for future training days.
- Get empty bird crates back to where they are stored.

Official Gun

Duties:

- ♦ In charge of all gunners—live and popper.
- Ensures all live gunners have a Hunter Safety Course Card and are over 16 years of age.
- Checks all firearms brought to the test by gunners of live birds.

Responsible for all ammunition, live popper and primer loads.

At the end of the test, accounts for all club guns, making sure they are locked away in the trailer and makes arrangements for cleaning the club guns used at the test.

Hospitality Chair

Duties:

- Makes arrangements for the judges dinner and tailgate party.
- Supplies all drinks—both soda and water—to all stakes.
- Makes lunches for judges and workers and entrants if the club elects to give lunches to all entrants. The Hunt Test Chair and Committee will let the Hospitality Chair know if the club is supplying the handlers and other guests with lunches.
- Order the judges gifts
- In charge of any raffles, auctions, games and puppy stakes run during the tests or at the tailgate party.
- In charge of clean up during the test and after the test is over.
- Hires the test photographer.

The different Chairs can delegate some or all the jobs as they need.

Important Things That Need To Be Done in Advance:

- ♦ Secure the Hunt Test Site
- ♦ Send in the Hunt Test Application
- ♦ Order Birds
- ♦ Order Duck Bands
- ♦ Order Rosettes
- ♦ Hire Judges
- Make Tailgate Party and Judges Dinner arrangements

As you can see, there is a lot of preparation and work that goes into hosting a hunt test. Simply put, the more people who volunteer, the less any one person has to do alone.

Please consider volunteering at our next Hunt Test. The Hunt Test Premium is already being drafted. It's not too early to volunteer and begin organizing the event.
